

An exciting new pass for **Germany and Poland** combining two of central Europe's most loved destinations.

A day of rail travel is a 24 hour period from midnight to midnight. This allows for unlimited travel on any number of trains for each day of use. Travel days may be used consecutively or non-consecutively.

General information

Free Child Offer: Two children aged 4-11 years inclusive travels free for each paying adult or senior. The free child offer must be requested at the time of booking the adult or senior pass. Additional children aged 4-11 years purchase a Youth fare. Children under 4 years travel free if not occupying a seat / bed. Seat reservation fees still apply.

Bonuses

Passholders are granted reduced fares and sometimes even free offers.

Note: Free Bonus Offers may necessitate usage of a Day on the Pass.

- Special travel bonuses: to be arranged locally (subject to change without notice)
- Free sailings on boats operated by the "KD German Rhine Line" along the Rhine between Koeln and Mainz and on the river Mosel between Koblenz and Chochem.
- Free travel on the S-Bahn (local railways) that operated in the major German cities (restrictions apply).

Conditions

- Residents of Europe, UK, Turkey, Morocco, Algeria and Tunisia are not eligible to purchase or use a Germany - Poland Rail Pass.
- If you have been working/residing or travelling in Europe for 6 months or more you are not eligible to travel with a Eurail Pass.
- Passes must be validated within 6 months of issuing date.
- Passes must be validated prior to boarding first train/ first use of travel bonus.
- Free Child Offer: Two children aged 4-11 years inclusive travels free for each paying adult or senior. The free child offer must be requested at the time of booking the adult or senior pass. Additional children aged 4-11 years purchase a Youth fare. Children under 4 years travel free if not occupying a seat / bed. Seat reservation fees still apply.
- Seat reservation fees are an additional charge and not inclusive in the cost of the pass.
- What is the 7pm rule?
 - If your train departs before 19.00 hrs (7 pm), you need to use two travel days
 - If you are travelling on a direct night train (with no connections or layovers) that departs after 19.00 hrs (7 pm) and arrives after 04.00 hrs (4 am), you only need to use one day (the day of arrival).Please note: your Pass must be valid on the day of departure and arrival.
- Comprehensive conditions of use can be found on the ticket cover.

Refunds

- Germany - Poland Rail Passes must be presented for refund unused and not validated.
- A 25% cancellation fee plus GST (only in Australia) applies to totally unused passes returned within 6 months of issuing date.
- No partial refunds.
- Germany - Poland Rail Passes cannot be refunded or reissued if lost or stolen.
