

The third largest country in Europe, Sweden offers a diverse range of sights. Malmö is home to incredible art galleries and progressive design. The capital Stockholm hands out prizes for peace and is known for its social equality. In Northern Lapland, the Sami people still herd reindeer for sustenance.

A day of rail travel is a 24 hour period from midnight to midnight. This allows for unlimited travel on any number of trains for each day of use. Travel days may be used consecutively or non consecutively.

General information

To start using the pass it must be validated at a European train station before your first journey.

Each further day of travel must be entered on your pass before you board the train.

If on any day you travel on an overnight train that departs after 7pm and don't change trains before midnight then you only have to enter the following day on your Pass.

Please note: A Sweden Eurail Pass is valid with the national railway company SJ and also valid on the following private railway lines:

- Direct SJ trains to and from Copenhagen and Copenhagen Airport
- Direct border crossing trains from Göteborg and Stockholm to Oslo

Conditions

- Residents of Europe, Turkey and North Africa (Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia) are not eligible to purchase or use a Sweden Pass.
- If you have been working/residing or traveling in Europe for 6 months or more you are not eligible to travel with a Eurail Pass.
- Passes must be validated within 6 months of issuing date by a railway official in Sweden.
- Passes must be validated prior to boarding the first train or first use of a bonus offer.
- 7:00pm rule does not apply
- Seat reservation fees are an additional charge and not inclusive in the cost of the pass.
- Comprehensive conditions of use can be found on the ticket cover.

Refunds

- Passes must be presented for refund unused and not validated.
- A 25% cancellation fee plus GST (only in Australia) applies to totally unused passes returned within 6 months of issuing date.
- Eurail Sweden Passes cannot be refunded or reissued if lost or stolen.
