

Germany has never been more exciting or accessible.

The **German Rail Pass Flexi** is valid for unlimited travel on any **3,4,5,7, 10 or 15 days** in **1 month**. Travel days may be used consecutively or non-consecutively.

A day of rail travel is a 24 hour period from midnight to midnight. This allows for unlimited travel on any number of trains for each day of use.

German Rail Pass Flexi Information

Things to note:

- To start using the pass it must be validated at a European train station before your first journey.
- Each further day of travel must be entered on your pass before you board the train.
- **Free Child Offer:** Two children aged 6-11 years inclusive travels free for each paying adult. The free child offer must be requested at the time of booking the adult pass. Additional children aged 6-11 years will need to purchase a Youth fare. Children under 6 years travel free if not occupying a seat / bed. Seat reservation fees still apply.

Additional Routes included with the German Rail Pass

- Select international cities on ICE/EC trains (Bologna, Bolzano/Bozen, Brussels, Innsbruck, Kufstein, Liege, Trento, Venice, Verona)
- ICE International trains to/from Brussels and Liege
- Usage of the DB/Austrian railways EuroCity trains to Kufstein, Innsbruck, Bolzano/Bozen, Trento, Verona, Bologna and Venice
- DB IC busses on the following lines:
 - Berlin-Wroclaw(Glowny)-Katowice-Krakow
 - Dusseldorf-Roermond-Eindhoven-Antwerp-Ghent-Lille
 - Dusseldorf-Maastricht-Liège
 - Frankfurt (Main)-Frankfurt Hahn Airport-Trier-Luxemburg
 - Hamburg-Amsterdam (Sloterdijk)
 - Munich-Memmingen-Chur-Como-Milano
 - Munich-Regensburg-Prague
 - Mannheim-Heidelberg-Nuremberg (ZOB)-Prague
 - Leipzig-Prague
- Reservations are mandatory on ICE trains to/from Brussels/Liege and DB Busses.

Payment & Ticketing

Regular German Rail Pass Conditions:

- Residents of Europe, the United Kingdom, Turkey, Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia and the Russian Federation

are not eligible to purchase or use a German Rail Pass

- Passes must be validated within 11 months of issuing date by a railway official in Germany
- Passes must be validated prior to boarding the first train/ first use of travel bonus.
- Free Child Offer: Two children aged 6-11 years inclusive travels free for each paying adult. The free child offer must be requested at the time of booking the adult pass. Additional children aged 6-11 years will need to purchase a Youth fare. Children under 6 years travel free if not occupying a seat / bed. Seat reservation fees still apply.
- All parties must be present when validating the pass.
- Seat reservation fees are an additional charge and not inclusive in the cost of the pass.
- What is the 7pm rule?
 - If your train departs before 19.00 hrs (7 pm), you need to use two travel days
 - If you are travelling on a direct night train (with no connections or layovers) that departs after 19.00 hrs (7 pm) and arrives after 04.00 hrs (4 am), you only need to use one day (the day of arrival). Please note: your pass must be valid on the day of departure and arrival.
- Comprehensive conditions of use can be found on the ticket cover.

We also recommend that you take out suitable travel insurance to cover (as a minimum) the costs incurred if you cancel your trip.

Cancellation & Amendments

Conditions:

- A \$20 per pass fee applies for amendments to unused passes returned within one year of issuing date.
- Passes must be presented for refund unused and not validated.
- A fee of \$30 per person, per pass applies to totally unused passes returned within one year of issuing date.
- No partial refunds.
- German Rail Passes cannot be reissued if lost or stolen.
